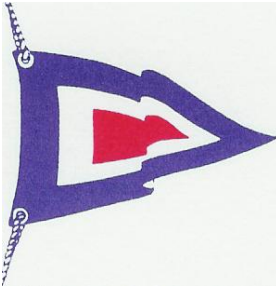

## MEMBERSHIP PROCEDURE

1. As a prospective member(s) you will first attend a Board of Directors meeting (second Monday of the month at the club, 7:00 PM) where you will present your application and a check for the required fees.
2. The membership will be informed of your application in the following monthly newsletter, *The Foghorn*.
3. You will then need to attend the following regular membership meeting (third Wednesday, 7:30 PM), at which time you will be introduced to the membership.
4. The Board will then vote on your application at their next regular meeting.
5. You will then attend the following regular meeting to be sworn into membership and receive your burgee, membership cards and keys to the club.

The costs of club membership include an initial one-time assessment, plus payment of the first recurring quarterly fees.

The **ONE-TIME ASSESSMENT** includes the following:

The **RECURRING QUARTERLY FEES** include the following:

Dues	\$ 25.00
Loan Repayment Fund	92.50
Capital improvement fund	85.00
Dredging fund	15.00
Activities fee	<u>15.00</u>
	\$ 232.50

Total Due with Membership Application: \$ 1,032.50
